



Associate Professor Pham Le Tuan, MD., PhD. is former Vice Minister of Health of Vietnam (2013-2018). He had many years working at Hanoi Health Department as head of health planning division before promoting as Vice Director in 2002. He moved to the Ministry of Health as Vice Director of Planning and Finance in 2008 and the Director in 2009. He had been appointed as Vice Minister of Health in May 2013, where he was responsible for health financing, social health insurance, external aid and grassroots health care. He received MD degree from Hanoi Medical University in 1982, Master in Primary Health Care Management from

Mahidol University, Thailand in 1995 and PhD degree from the Military Medical University, Vietnam in 2000. He had been one of the key persons to strongly support and advocate for Universal Health Coverage in Vietnam. He took the leading role at the Ministry of Health in developing basic health benefit packages, health technology assessment, payment mechanism and health insurance expansion. He was also head of Family Medicine Faculty, Hanoi Medical University (2012-2018). Currently, he is President of Vietnam Civil-Military Medical Association, a non-profit-organization that promote health and education for the community. He is Chair of Country Coordinator Mechanism of Global Fund to Fight HIV, Tuberculosis and Malaria in Vietnam (2020- now), Global Fund Alternate Board Member (5/2021 - 8/2023), Global Fund Board Member (8/2023 - now)
